CRAVEN MOUNTAINEERING CLUB

RESTRICTIONS WITH REGARD TO MEMBERS BRINGING DOGS ON MEETS

The principal purpose of club meets is to promote the interests of mountaineers and to foster interest in mountain activities. The CMC Committee reserve the right to amend these restrictions at any time should they feel it has become necessary.

- 1. The meet co-ordinator will decide whether they will allow dogs to attend a meet and will set the maximum number of dogs they will allow to attend that meet.
- 2. Members bringing dogs on meets are responsible for ensuring that there are no access restrictions regarding dogs. (A meet co-ordinator allowing dogs on a meet does not mean that access is assured).
- 3. On climbing meets, it is the dog owner's responsibility to check that dogs are permitted on the crag.
- 4. Generally, dogs will not be allowed into club huts but may, at the discretion of the hut meets secretary, be allowed on hut meets.
- 5. If a member intends to bring a dog to a meet, they must advise the meet co-ordinator in good time prior to that meet.
- 6. There must be no more than one dog per adult dog carer attending a meet.
- 7. The meet co-ordinator has the right to veto the continued attendance of a member and their dog at any point during the meet.
- 8. Members must ensure that they are capable of independently and safely leaving the meet with their dog should this requirement arise for any reason.
- 9. Responsibility for the dog lies with the owner/carer at all times.
- 10. Members and their dogs must abide by the law along with 'Good Practice Advice' set out in the Countryside Code and by the guidance given by the BMC. - 11. The member undertakes to have liability insurance covering incidents that may be cause by their dog.
- 12. These restrictions apply to all activities organised by and through the Craven Mountaineering Club.
